Online Safety Tip of the Week

When is it an appropriate age to give your child their first phone?

Should children have Smartphones? What are the risks of having an internet enabled device at a young age? As a parent, it can be overwhelming to make a decision about when to give your child their first phone, and even their first Smartphone with ready access to the Internet and the various social media apps. In some ways, having their own phone can be a great opportunity for children to develop independence, but having clear rules and expectations is also important, as well as having safeguards to ensure that children are not exposed to inappropriate content or other harms from social media. It is also important to remember that Smartphones are now banned in many secondary schools and that this is likely to extend to primary schools in the near future. Internet Matters helps by providing a useful guide to parents on how to choose the right mobile phone, and what consider when getting your child their first phone:

HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR AUTISTIC CHILD TO DEVELOP TOILETING SKILLS

In partnership with the Autism Education Trust (AET) we are offering Developing Toileting in the Early Years Training for Parent + Carers of autistic children.

Aims:

- To develop knowledge of how to support autistic children to achieve toileting independence.
- To understand the importance of working with others to support autistic children to develop independent toileting skills

Learning objectives:

- Understand how autism can impact on children developing independent toileting skills.
- Understand the importance of all adults working together to support the development of independent toileting skills.
- Consider how to remove barriers to developing toileting skills and how to make reasonable adjustments to support further toileting independence.

Why Become a School Governor?

- Have a positive impact on students' education and support families in the school
- Take on a leadership role that contributes to the future of the local area.

- Make meaningful connections with likeminded people.
- Gain a deeper understanding of how schools operate and education policy works. Develop valuable skills in leadership, strategic planning, finance, and oversight. Access training and development opportunities to enhance your personal and professional growth.
- Enjoy a sense of fulfilment by giving back to your community.

What Does a School Governor Do?

- Work with the leadership to set the school's vision, ethos, and strategic direction. Monitor the school's budget to ensure resources are used effectively and in the best interests of students.
- Ensure the school complies with key policies such as safeguarding, equality, and financial oversight.
- Provide constructive challenge and support to hold school leaders accountable.
 Act as a link between the school, parents, and the wider community.
- Attend events such as the Winter Fair, Sports Day, and Prize Givings to engage with the school community.

What Would I Be Committing

- Attend 6 meetings per year: 3 in-person full governing board meetings (one per term) and 3 virtual committee meetings on Monday evenings (6-8pm).
- Ideally, visit the school once a term during the school day to explore areas of interest, such as safeguarding, curriculum delivery, or student well-being.
- Potential involvement in occasional panels, such as headteacher pay or disciplinary issues.
- Participate in school events to connect with staff, parents, and pupils.

Can Anyone be a Governor?

- A <u>clear DBS check</u> is required to ensure the safety of students.
- We welcome individuals from all backgrounds with enthusiasm, motivation, and a willingness to learn.
- No prior experience in education or governance is required **training and support are provided.**
- If you don't live locally, a commitment to understanding the school's community and context is important.
- There are plenty of resources to help new governors get up to speed quickly.


