A Message from our Headteacher

Dear Parents.

We have had a lovely week. The children have started their new topics and are settling well into their new classes. This week we welcomed back our nursery children and said hello to some new starters. Next week is assessment week, children from Reception to Year 6 will sit baseline assessment tests. These assessments will help your childs class teacher ensure they are given work at the correct level.

Attendance

Please remember it is your legal duty as a parent to ensure your child attends school daily. It is tempting with rising living costs to take your child out of school for holidays or outings, however this can result in statutory fines and involvement from Family Early Help. Please ensure you report any absences to the office before 9am to make sure they are reported in line with our absence reporting system. Absence will be listed on your child's school report both before we break for the winter holiday in December and again in July. If your child's attendance falls below 90% you will receive a letter regarding absence and in some cases, you will be invited to meet myself and or the local authority to discuss ways in which we can support you with attendance for the upcoming year.

Harvest Food Collection

We will be supporting local food banks this year by collecting dried and tinned foods, toiletries and baby products. Each class will be provided with a collection box, they will be encouraged to fill their class box. Classes who collect the most items will win a prize so please help them to bring in a few items for the class collection!




