






Behaviour Expectations

Participation on our school trips depends on students' behavior. To promote positive conduct and manage misbehavior, we've implemented a trip-attendance behavior system. Each child starts with **20 points**. Points are deducted for inappropriate behavior based on the severity of the action:

- •An "Internal" incident results in a 5-point deduction.
- "Red Card" leads to a 4-point deduction.
- •a "Minus 10" indicates a severe offense and 3-point deduction.
- "Minus 5" equates to a 2-point deduction.
- "Warning 2" equates to a 1 point deduction.






Reading
