This Term's Topics:

Geometry: Identifying and describing 2D and 3D shapes. **Place Value:** Understanding numbers up to 20. **Addition &**

Subtraction: Solving equations within 20,

Hands-on Learning at Home: You don't need fancy equipment to practice Maths! Try these fun ideas:



Pasta & Cereal: Use dried pieces as "counters" to practice adding groups together or exploring place value. **Playdough**

Subtraction: Roll small balls of dough to represent a number, then "smash" them as you subtract to find the total remaining.

Daily Reading: Please read every night with your child for 5-10 minutes and sign their reading records - certificates, stickers and a mini party will be rewarded to children who reach the targets.

Science Texture Collage using our senses:

Search for things that feel; rough, soft, bumpy, smooth, scratchy. Then place your paper over the top of the material and rub a crayon across the top to capture the texture. Finally, assemble and glue your found treasures and rubbings onto a large sheet of paper or into your homework books.



Topic - Create your own fluffy Polar Bear or igloo:



Every week, choose one activity to complete in your homework book. You can write a single sentence, a list of words, or even add a drawing and label it!

Week 1: Stanley's Secret Stick

Go on a walk and find a special stick. Use your imagination—is it a wand, a telescope, or a dinosaur bone? Draw your stick and write: "My stick is a..."



Week 2: Winter Senses

Look out the window or go outside. Write one thing you can see (like white frost) and one thing you can hear (like crunchy leaves or a cold wind).

Week 3: The "St" Word Challenge

Stanley starts with 'St'. Can you find and write 3 other things that start with the 'St' sound? (Hint: Star, Stick, Step, Stop)

Week 4: Astro Girl's Space Suitcase

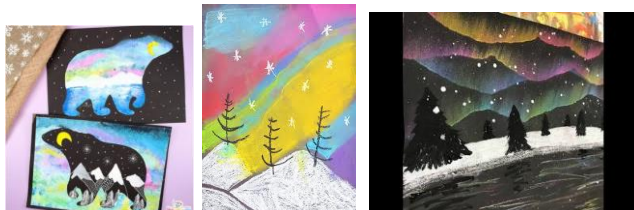
Imagine you are going to space like Astrid. What are 3 things you would pack in your space backpack? Write a list of your items (e.g., snack, book, bear).
