TRY TO COMPLETE AT LEAST ONE OF THE WRITING TASKS

1. Draw a Venn diagram to sort similarities and differences between life in the Iron Age and life today. Write about your findings.
2. Make a timeline of events and changes from this period. Use your knowledge of ordering numbers to make sure the events are accurately placed on the timeline. Present it in a creative way.
3. Find out about Iron Age Hillforts. Create a poster with what you learn.
4. If an Iron Age man/woman was transported to the present day, think of 10 questions that you would ask them

NOW CHOOSE SOME OR ALL OF THESE

1. Design a piece of Iron Age art using materials of your choice.
2. Imagine you lived in the Iron Age, make a tool to help you survive.
3. Research the food that was eaten during the Iron Age. Create your own Iron Age recipe. Either bring in an example of what you have made or take photographs. Remember to write the recipe down.
